

## **GOVERNORS VILLAGE COVID-19 POOL NOTICE**

For your health and the health and safety of our Governors Village Community and our staff, please exercise social responsibility while on premises. Neither the POA, Townes Property, nor the pool operator or their employees can be responsible for preventing the spread of germs throughout the facility, including related to COVID-19. The Governors Village pool facilities are open to use solely AT YOUR OWN RISK, and users are responsible for wiping down surfaces, social distancing within the facility as publicly recommended or required, and using personal protective equipment (gloves, masks, etc.) in accordance with CDC requirements. Any and all individuals entering the pool facility are specifically warned that the POA cannot guarantee the premises are sanitized to the degree that would prevent the spread of COVID-19.

**DO NOT ENTER IF YOU OR ANYONE IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD HAS A COUGH, FEVER, OR OTHER SYMPTOM OF ILLNESS, HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 WITHIN THE LAST 14 DAYS, OR HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITHIN SOMEONE WHO HAS BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH COVID-19.**

Please be aware that until notified by the POA or Towne Properties, the rules listed in this Notice shall be in addition to the 2020 Pool Rules. In case of a conflict between the rules in this Notice and the 2020 Pool Rules, the rules in this Notice shall be deemed to control to resolve such conflict.

# GOVERNORS VILLAGE COVID-19 RULES

We know many residents are anxious to get their families outside and in the pool; however, we need everyone to do your part and remember, that we are still living under a pandemic. We want everyone to be able to enjoy the pool, but as importantly, we want to keep everyone safe – but, the only way we can do that is if everyone reads, understands and follows the rules and restrictions that are necessary to adhere to the guidelines mandated by Governor Roy Cooper’s office.

- Per the regulations, our current capacity limit has been reduced. **Only 34 people are allowed in the pool water at any given time, while a total of up to 88 people are allowed for the deck capacity.** Please be considerate of others and keep your use of pool to a couple of hours to allow others to enjoy it. If this rule is not followed, residents may be asked to leave the pool, and the pool closed until a different usage system is determined and instituted.
- **Members of different households must maintain 6 feet of social distancing.** Members of the same household do not need to maintain 6 feet of social distancing.
- Please do not bring non-resident guests to the pool during the capacity limitation period, as we want to be able to maximize resident usage.
- **NO toys allowed.** There will not be a lost and found. Any items left at pool will be thrown away.
- **NO swim lessons** will be allowed.
- **NO Pool Parties** will be allowed, nor will any reservations be taken.
- **NO confrontations or physical altercations** will be tolerated.
- **NO kitchen access or grill use** during the capacity limitation period.
- During the capacity limitations, it is anticipated that there may be limited or no lounge chairs and/or tables. Outside chairs are not allowed to be brought into the pool area.
- Pool hours may be adjusted during the pool season, and any changes will be emailed to residents as well as posted at the pool.
- The above rules are meant for everyone’s safety, and also to allow our residents to be able to use the pool. These rules may be adjusted based on residents’ usage or due to additional State mandates.
- Residents who are found disobeying or disregarding the above rules may have their pool privileges immediately revoked, and shall remain revoked until a due process hearing is able to be held to determine an appropriate course of action.
- **If anyone develops COVID-19 contact your management team immediately.** The pool will then close for 2 weeks and a notice will be emailed.
